The Fire District proposes an Annual Budget of \$2,316,306.00 for 2018 compared to 2,020,006.00 for 2017. The significant change is for an increase in the Capital Appropriations is due to 2 acquisitions approved by the voters — one for a new fire apparatus and the other for a service vehicle.

Complete a brief statement on the impact the proposed Annual Budget will have on the Amount to be Raised by Taxation to support the district budget and on the Restricted and Unrestricted Fund Balance(s). Explain increases or decreases in the tax rate and utilization of fund balances. The District's Amount to be Raised by Taxation will increase from \$1,131,306 in 2017 to \$1,187,606 in 2018 and its use of Unrestricted Fund Balance will be \$518,000.00 compared to the \$300,000.00 used in 2017 to fund the Capital Items and help offset the tax rate. The projected tax rate will increase from 8 point 2 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation to 8 point 3 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation.

3. Include a statement explaining how the Fire District is complying with the Property Tax Levy Cap. The statement must explain reasons for exceeding the Levy Cap and identify the appropriations that caused the Fire District to exceed the Levy Cap, and how they are being addressed by a referendum.

The District is in compliance with the 2% maximum cap levy restriction.
